Wave 1 providers are reminded that they need to complete SEA Monitoring Form B detailing how they have spent their Specialist Equipment Allocation – including an itemised fully priced invoice listing for each T Level route funded. CHANGES TO THE T LEVEL DATA RETURN (FORMERLY STATISTICAL ANNEX)

For the May 2021 data collection, we will have a simpler, online data collection tool which will be easier to complete. This will be accessible through your organisation's DfE Sign-in account. We are always looking at how we can improve the provider experience and would like to thank the T Level provider volunteers who supported this development. All T Level providers have a DfE sign-in account, so please make sure that you have your organisation's log in and password ready for when the **collection opens on 19 April**.

In early April, we will send all T Level providers an invitation to complete the May 2021 return, **to be completed by 14 May**. This will be sent along with supporting guidance from our Statistical.Annexes@education.gov.uk mailbox. We will use the data collected to inform the specialist equipment allocation modelling work for the next round and to ensure that the T Levels website for students and employers is up-to-date ready for autumn recruitment.

T LEVEL COURSE DIRECTORY

The National Careers Service has been making improvements to the 'Publish to the course directory' platform to give providers more control over their course information.

Providers offering T Levels that started in 2020, or are due to start in 2021 or 2022, can now update course details directly using the National Careers Service's [Publish to the course directory service](#). Please check your information and make sure you, or your relevant colleague/s, know how to access and use the course directory platform.
