T LEVEL PROGRESSION PROFILES

T LEVEL EMPLOYER INCENTIVE SCHEME DELIVERING REAL BENEFITS TO BUSINESS

Employers are realising the benefits of accessing the £1,000 T Level employer incentive payment for each student they host on a high-quality industry placement. Many employers are accessing the incentive payment, for up to 20 students – and can do so until **July 2022.**

Amongst those employers are **Nutri Troops**, an online employer managing an interactive healthy lifestyle webapp game for children aged 6-11 years old. Peter Bakare Founder and CEO at Nutri Troops said:

"Accessing £6000 via the T Level incentive payment for employers gave Nutri Troops the opportunity to provide outstanding conditions for students to undertake their placement within, including designated office space, assigned supervisors, and active break activities."

Meanwhile, Dan Baird, director at INFINITY 27, a small business with seven employees, covering gaming, interactive 3D and augmented and virtual reality added:

"The T Levels employer incentive is good news for employers and will hopefully encourage more businesses to offer industry placements, critically benefiting students who have been disadvantaged due to the pandemic. The incentive payment should be used to provide meaningful placements and to improve the quality of placements, to match the high bar set by the T Level standard."
